Reorganizing the Trophy Case Turns into a History Lesson

Many people often glance at trophy cases without actually taking the time to really look at each award.

They see the cases as a mere 'package of contents' and don't realize that the sum total of these countless trophies actually tells a story about the teams that earned the awards.

For those wooden display cases, stored behind glass and illuminated by lights, is the history of our school's athletic prowess and academic achievements.

While my family and I thought that our offer to organize the trophy cases would simply result in better presentation and some well earned volunteer time, we soon came to realize that it

would instead be a history lesson in the achievements of the school and our numerous ventures and activities throughout the years. St. Vincent School has a lot to be proud of, as our trophy cases

contain 127 awards, trophies, and plaques spanning five decades. In the process of organizing the awards, we noticed that not only do the cases contain trophies and plaques; there are also pictures,

relay batons, and signed soccer and volley balls.

Upon sorting the awards it became clear that during different decades we were stronger in certain sports. For example, in the late 1960s and 1970s, we did very well in baseball—a sport that is no longer represented by any CYO team in our parish.

Conversely, most of the trophies from the 1980s and 1990s were predominately basketball and elementary track.

In the early 2000s, our CYO track team garnered a staggering 19 awards, but our school was aptly represented by the strengths of our academics, with the various math teams bringing in a total of 13 trophies or plaques. (continued on p.2)

(cont. from p.1) Additionally, the number of trophies has increased over the years, thus requiring Principal Wanda Stewart to purchase two new trophy cases.

Hidden among the athletic trophies, there are also many interesting awards for other school-related activities. Back in the late '70s and early '80s, our school sponsored an annual paper drive, in which homerooms competed to see who could bring in the most newspaper to be recycled and redeemed for cash.

Each morning the

paper would be packed in brown paper bags, measure, and loaded on a truck. At the end of the week, the homeroom who brought in the most paper was the champion for that year. Although Blanchet homeroom usually won, Mr. Rainier held the record for the most paper collected: an amazing 7,602 inch tall stack.

In the 1980s and 1990s, St. Vincent's would also hold an annual 'Academy Awards' ceremony, during which Vinnies (empty Mrs. Butterworth syrup bottles painted gold) would be presented to winners in different categories that year.

One such award was for the 'Best Supporting Parents' for a group of parents who exemplified stellar service and volunteer time. Oddly enough the winners that year called themselves the St. Vincent Vandals.

In summation, the oldest trophy in the case is a 1967 baseball award, and the most recent (and also the largest) is the 2009 CYO Track Championship trophy.

So, the next time you are in the gymnasium, don't just walk past the trophy cases; stop and take a look because you might be surprised by what you find.
